Branches and Regions in action

IBMS regional groups are your local professional network. They organise scientific and social events, offer local support, and act as a voice for members at national level.

Each Branch and Region is run by dedicated volunteers who help:

- Organise CPD-accredited events such as scientific talks, study days, and member meetups
- Promote the profession to students, early career scientists and the public
- Provide local input into IBMS policy and campaigns
- Support the development of new Branches where none currently exist

If you live in an area without an active Branch, we'll support you to get one started. Your Regional Committee or Council Member can help you set up, connect you with fellow members, and attend early meetings.
