## A night of success for N. Ireland Laboratories at the Ulster University's inaugural Impact Excellence Awards 2017

Leading organisations across a wide range of sectors have been recognised for their commitment to graduate employability and research at Ulster University's inaugural Impact Excellence Awards ceremony held on 11 May 2017.

From more than 180 applications, 35 partnership organisations were shortlisted into categories across employability and research at the prestigious event, which celebrated how Ulster University's civic partnerships are positively impacting upon students, society and economy. Laboratories from both the Belfast Health & Social Care Trust (BHSCT) and the South Eastern Health & Social Care Trust (SEHSCT) were shortlisted in the public sector category. For two laboratory sites to be shortlisted was a great achievement and recognition of the continuing commitment which Laboratories across N.Ireland provide to Ulster University placement students each year.

The Laboratories of the Belfast Trust received the award for *Placement Employer in the Public Sector* category and the Laboratories of the South Eastern Health & Social Care Trust (SEHSCT) received a Highly Commended certificate.

This achievement follows on from last year's success, when the Belfast Trust Laboratories received a "Highly Commended" certificate at the Ulster University Placement Employer of the Year Awards in 2016.

Hospital Laboratories across N.Ireland facilitate a 52 week placement programme each year for up to 25 Ulster University students undertaking the integrated degree programme in Biomedical Sciences with Diploma in Professional Practice (Pathology). During placement the students complete the Institute of Biomedical Sciences (IBMS) certificate of competence training portfolio, and following successful completion of their degree programme are then eligible to apply for Health and Care Professions Council (HCPC) professional registration and Biomedical Scientist positions.
